The momentum of The Cary Council continues to increase. We are delighted to share that, to date, the 18 UT Southwestern investigators who received The Cary Council's Early-Stage Research Grants have secured more than \$15 million in follow-on funding across several important areas including breast cancer, brain cancer, genomic technologies, infectious disease, and pediatrics.

As we set our gaze on the community's future health needs, we are inspired by the promise of tomorrow. Together, we will continue to pursue a higher standard for medical research, education, and patient care.






Here's What Our Endowed Funds Support


