

2024 YEAR IN REVIEW Memorial Design Team Announced

he Global War on Terrorism Memorial intentionally curated with a diverse set of experts, creatives, and individuals personally impacted by the war to ensure the Memorial reflects the magnitude of this ongoing international conflict.

The Foundation is fortunate to have Kengo Kuma, a world-renowned architect, leading its Design Team. Kuma san, along with his team at Kengo Kuma & Associates, is known for a poetic use of water that brings a sense of tranquility and quiet—ideal for this space of hope and healing.

Named one of Time's "100 Most Influential People" in 2021, Kuma san has led design for some of the world's most famous buildings, including the Japan National Stadium in Tokyo, the V&A Dundee Museum in Scotland, the Centro de Arte Moderna Gulbenkian in Lisbon. and the Rolex Building in Dallas, Texas.

With offices around the world. Kuma san and his team will bring an international perspective to the Memorial to appropriately reflect the global nature of the Global War on Terrorism. This is not only important to the Foundation's Board of Directors, Staff, and Design Advisory Council, but also to over 80% of Americans surveyed through our Help Design History campaign, which included 20,000 participants from all 50 states, representing every branch of the military as well as civilians.

Kuma san and his colleagues are collaborating closely with the Foundation's Design Team, which consists of the Board of Directors and the Design Advisory Council, to create a tribute to the men and women who have bravely answered the call to serve.

In 2024, Kuma san met with members of the Design Advisory Council, listened to more than 20 hours of personal stories, and inquired about their desires for the Memorial.

Currently, Kuma san and his team are working on design concepts for the Memorial. We look forward to sharing more updates on the Design Team's progress throughout 2025.

Foundation Names Fellowship Program in Honor of Operation Jawbreaker





In May, the Foundation was proud to announce the launch of Operation Jawbreaker Fellowship Program, named in honor of the historic CIA mission Operation Jawbreaker, the first ever U.S. operation in the Global War on Terrorism.

Fellowships are an important part of the Foundation's legacy. Even after our Memorial is built on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., our Fellows will help raise awareness of the Global War on Terrorism, its heroes, and its lasting impact on our Nation's history.

The Foundation's Fellows serve one-year terms and, at the time of the announcement, included Gold Star Fellow, Krista Simpson Anderson, and Gold Star Child Fellow, Megan Taylor.


